Reading II 1 Jn 2:1-5a

My children, I am writing this to you so that you may not commit sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous one.

He is expiation for our sins, and not for our sins only but for those of the whole world. The way we may be sure that we know him is to keep his commandments. Those who say, "I know him," but do not keep his commandments are liars, and the truth is not in them. But whoever keeps his word, the love of God is truly perfected in him.

Gospel Lk 24:35-48

The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread. While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost.

Then he said to them, "Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have."

And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, he asked them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of baked fish; he took it and ate it in front of them.

He said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled."

Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures. And he said to them, "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things."

Reflection Questions

- What word, phrase or idea struck you in the reading?
- What do you think God is trying to say to you personally?
- Peter has gone through a remarkable experience of change and has the confidence to preach the core christian message to unbelievers. However, his preaching is connected with his 'living' and the 'signs' that he works (he just cured someone!). 'Preaching' comes after 'living'. What sign / action / witness can I live this week to let people experience Jesus through me?
- Some people in the Johannine community believed that *knowledge* of salvation was salvation. Knowing Jesus and his forgiveness was all that was important. Moral behaviour, changing one's lifestyle didn't matter. Is there anything that I am doing in my life that Jesus wouldn't do? What is 1 area of my life I feel called to make a change in?
- "Why are you troubled and what are the questions rising in your heart" What are the things I need to look at so as to reach the peace Jesus offers me?
- The Season of Easter is for 50 days leading up to Pentecost. While Lent focussed on repentance from sin, Easter focusses on joy and celebration of God's victory. What is a joyful Easter attitude, habit or practise you could live during the Easter season?
- What is one action that you will do to 'livetheword' this week?
